News recently came to hand that Pte. James Scanlan Leigh, 2nd R.M.L.I., only son of Mr. James Leigh, and the late Mrs. Leigh, for many years residents in Halling, nad been killed in action. He enlisted on August 17th, 1911, at Kingston-on-Thames. For a considerable time he served on H.M.S. Triumph, and went through all engagements with the Japanese at Toing Tang. He landed with the New Zealand Contingents at Suvia Bay onthat memorable Sunday morning, and was at the evacuation of Gallipoli. He also took part in the Battle of Beaumont Hamel, in France, and other engagements, and was twice wounded, being at last killed in action on July 11th, 1917, at the age of 25 years. His father is at present living at Buxton, Derbyshire, and has had much sympathy extended to him by his old Halling friends.
